



Our focus is to fund scholarship awards and grants from the earnings of the invested endowments keeping principle funds intact.





Scholarships

PGSF is working to build the future workforce of the graphic communications industry through our annual educational scholarships program. Each year we provide technical school, undergraduate and graduate fellowship assistance to individuals interested in a career in the graphic communications field.

Our recipients include full-time and part-time students as well as individuals currently working in Graphic Communications seeking additional education. The online application period runs annually from November 1 to May 1. Applications are evaluated during May and June, and recipients are notified in July and August. Scholarship awards vary in amount from \$1,500 to \$10,000 per academic year, in most

cases, for up to four years provided the recipient maintains a high scholastic average and continues in an approved program of study.

In 2023, \$530,000 was awarded to 155 students, with an average scholarship of \$3,600.

Grants

2023 was our second year offering Educational use Grants. Applications were open to institutions and instructors directly engaged in Graphic Communication, Visual and Design Technology and Print-centric educational programs. High schools, trade schools, junior and community college associate programs, four-year colleges, and universities, along with Masters and Doctorate Degree programs applied.

The Grant review committee is comprised of PGSF board members and industry professionals. They evaluate, score, and review each request.

Over \$103,000 was awarded to 20 different institutions and instructors. These funds were used in a variety of ways, including equipment purchases, student travel expenses to attend print-related competitions, and off-campus course offerings.




Contests

In an effort to continue to raise awareness and engagement with educators, institutions and their students, PGSF has annual design contests.

Our contests are used to engage and promote the print industry and scholarships that PGSF funds for education in graphic communications. The annual Poster and T-Shirt Design Contest is open to high school and college students throughout the U.S. New in 2023 was a Box Design competition open to post-secondary students. The design contests represent different uses of print technology and knowledge for students. Students with winning designs were awarded \$500 each and received press coverage and printed copies of their submissions. Produced posters and t-shirts were distributed into many schools, at trade shows, and on digital channels.
